New content	<ul> <li>Units 8, 11 and 12 are left to be covered         <ul> <li>Unit 8- Travel and Tourism</li> <li>Unit 11- Education Post 16</li> <li>Unit 12- Jobs, Career Choices and Ambitions</li> </ul> </li> <li>These will be covered in class in the remaining 7/8 weeks</li> </ul>
Next steps	<ul> <li>All topics for the GCSE French course will have been covered, allowing pupils to access the subject in Further Education</li> <li>All four skills will be developed in order to allow pupils to progress to the best of their ability</li> </ul>

	The speaking endorsement will take a priority, as this will sit beside the GCSE
In-class assessments	<ul> <li>There will be in-class assessments on unit 8 and units 9-12</li> <li>These will be listening, reading and writing assessments</li> <li>They will be past paper questions on those topics and will be given time to revise and prepare</li> <li>They will complete photocards and role plays as written tasks</li> <li>There will be a series of extended writing tasks based on exam style questions</li> </ul>
Interventions	<ul> <li>Sessions will run on writing and speaking, as these are traditionally the most difficult and the skills in which pupils have had the least practice</li> <li>A timetable will be published, along with the names of the pupils invited to sessions</li> <li>Writing sessions will be separated by tier- one week will be targeting foundation candidates; one week will be targeting higher candidates</li> <li>Speaking sessions will be separated by confidence in speaking- one week for those targeting a pass; one week for those targeting a merit and one week for those targeting a distinction</li> <li>The reason for these sessions to be targeting specific pupils is to allow the teacher to provide the bes support for smaller groups of pupils- the advice and language requirements given to a grade 9 pupil will be very different to that given to a grade 4 pupil.</li> <li>Pupils will be able to work at their own level, with the ability to move to a different session if their session is too easy/difficult for them or they want to push themselves for a greater challenge</li> <li>The outcome is that pupils will be more confident in what is necessary to achieve the grade they wish to target</li> </ul>

Additional sessions	<ul> <li>Should pupils want extra contact time over the Easter holidays, this can be arranged with Mrs Tate-Harratt and will be conducted via Microsoft Teams</li> <li>Additional resources are being made available for self-study on Microsoft Teams</li> </ul>
Non-Examined Assessment (NEA)	<ul> <li>The speaking assessment this year will be an NEA</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>These are yet to be completed and will be completed by Mrs Tate-Harratt</li> <li>Pupils will complete a speaking recording home for assessment <ul> <li>This will be speaking questions- pupils will be given questions to record answers to</li> </ul> </li> <li>Pupils will complete a speaking assessment in school for assessment <ul> <li>Full assessment- role play, photo card and general conversation</li> </ul> </li> <li>Communication home will be necessary to ensure that all pupils attend the assessment and understand its importance.</li> </ul>
Range of evidence	<ul> <li>All end of unit assessments from units 1,2,3,4,5,6,7 will be used- these have been completed</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Assessments from units 8-12 will be used         <ul> <li>These will be completed at the end of the relevant units and only be on the unit taught</li> <li>Pupils can prepare for them by completing the revision activities on Kerboodle, learning the relavent vocabulary on Memrise, grammar revision on <u>www.languagesonline.org.uk</u>, videos on GCSE Pod</li> <li>Pupils know that an end of unit assessment follows each assessment, so this will follow the normal pattern</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>3 writing tasks will also be taken into consideration- one translation from French into English, one translation into French and one free writing task         <ul> <li>These will be set on topics from across the syllabus</li> <li>Pupils will have a choice of 2 questions for each writing task</li> <li>They will follow the appropriate task for the tier of entry</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Formal assessments	<ul> <li>Pupils will complete a full mock paper- listening, reading and writing (3 papers in total)</li> <li>Pupils will have covered the entire syllabus and therefore the specially released AQA papers will be used</li> <li>As per the mock exams previously, the writing exam will be held centrally in the hall; the listening and reading papers will be conducted in class (unless there is capacity to hold them centrally)</li> <li>Pupils will know that the papers will cover all topics</li> </ul>
