If there are home testing kits available in school, these will be given to parents/carers collecting symptomatic children, and to staff who've developed symptoms at school, if providing one will increase the likelihood of them getting tested. Any members of staff who have helped someone with symptoms and any pupils who have been in close contact with them do not need to go home to self-isolate unless they develop symptoms themselves (in which case, they should arrange a test) or if the symptomatic person subsequently tests positive (see below) or they have been requested to do so by NHS Test and Trace. In addition to these cintrol measures which are on place to mituigatre the risk of students and staff contrcating the virus, the school acknowledges that there are other areas of concern which will be addressed in the 'recovery plan' which will be a sognioficant element of the next year's Academy Improvement Plan.

Two key areas are:

Student and Staff wellbeing & Curriculum Recovery.

- Student and Staff wellbeing is a new Assistant Headteacher responsibility and wil focus on ensuring that the right support is in place for both groups.
 - > Student and Staff Wellbeing surveys ahead of September (student survey completed)
 - > New Student Welfare team developed, building on existing support and esnuring appropriate interventions are in place and accessible.
 - Staff welfare to be a higher priority access to counselling already in place and promoted.
- Curriculum Recovery
 - Limitaions in place because of 'bubble' aproach of teaching but specialist rooms have been kept free so Y11 then Y10 will have priority to ensure access to broad and balanced curriculum still.
 - > RE has been removed from Y11 to create additional time for options subjects to catch-up
 - > Remote/Digital learning a new Assistant Headteacher responsibility
 - > Increased focus on low-stakes testing to gauge impact of long term absence
 - > Focsu on reading to increase as per original plans
