
With access to important links, dates and information it's easy to navigate for students, parents as well as the general public.

Students paid their respects at the largest cemetery for Commonwealth forces in the world, for any war, at Tyne Cot. They also explored preserved sections of British trenches and visited two museums as well as enjoying some free time in the modern centre of Ypres city.

Not only a very humbling experience, the trip will help to place in context their history studies at the start of the new academic year in September.
